WHAT WE DO

At the Y, we create opportunities for people to improve their lives and their communities. Through empowering young people, improving individual and community well-being, and inspiring action, we aim to create meaningful change across the country.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL

The Y welcomes everyone, which is why our programs, services and initiatives are so wide ranging. We inspire kids to realize their potential, prepare teens for college and career, provide opportunities for families to bond, and support people of all ages and backgrounds to be healthier in spirit, mind and body. And that's just the beginning.

Dear Friends of the Y,

This past year and a half created a unique set of challenges that tested the perseverance and dedication of the Torrance-South Bay YMCA in serving our South Bay community. At the onset of the pandemic in March 2020, we had to close our facility to the public, resulting in the loss of income from membership fees and program service fees. Further closure effects included furloughing a majority of our staff, paying for unemployment and accrued vacation time for furloughed staff and continuing to fund building maintenance expenses. Our branch has gradually reopened and we are working towards reinstating staff, welcoming back members and reopening child care sites and senior centers.

Never before have our values of Social Responsibility been more important. In response to the COVID-19 national health emergency and associated closures, our branch initially pivoted to providing emergency childcare to hospital and essential workers in the community as well as meal delivery to seniors forced to isolate due to stay at home orders. Over time, the branch evolved our services to distance learning support for children, engagement and outreach to seniors, outdoor fitness classes for members, youth skills clinics and overnight summer camps, and community response through blood drives, food drives and service projects.

The Board of Directors of the YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles, which includes the Torrance-South Bay YMCA, recently announced their strategic vision to focus on the five key areas of healthy living, sports, education, youth and teens, and food insecurity. The Torrance-South Bay YMCA is proud to show in the upcoming pages how our branch is implementing those strategic priorities.

We look to our community – our Board of Managers, volunteers, donors, members and partners – to aid in our recovery so we can reinstate various programs, resources and services for our South Bay families.

The YMCA has remained committed in its mission and will continue to do so by providing financial assistance to those who need it, expanding childcare support as students are brought back on campus, continuing to support seniors and those experiencing food insecurity, and ensuring that no one is turned away from the YMCA due to the inability to pay for programs or services.

HEALTHY LIVING

Nurturing Your Well-Being

Having a healthy spirit, mind and body has always been a core value of the Y because living a healthy lifestyle benefits your physical health, improves your mood, boosts your energy, and combats isolation by bringing people together.

During the pandemic closure, the Y offered **virtual Y fitness and wellness classes** to keep members active and healthy. Once we were able to partially reopen, we offered safe, **outdoor exercise classes**. Eventually classes were moved indoors, more classes were added, and swimming was able to reconvene while adhering to COVID-19 protocols and safety procedures.

By implementing the **LA Y App** in 2021, Y members were able to reserve a socially distanced spot for group exercise classes, lap swimming, water fitness, personal training, and the Child Activity Center.

As a commitment to our community's health during the pandemic, the Y also hosted five Red Cross **blood drives**, a free **COVID-19 vaccine clinic**, and an **outdoor COVID-19 testing site**.

Bringing the Joy of Recreation to Our Youth

The Y has partnered with the Los Angeles Sports Council to bring fun and interactive sports classes and clinics like **Los Angeles Clippers®** basketball, **Los Angeles Galaxy®** soccer, and **Los Angeles Kings®** ball hockey to our communities.

Through positive coaching, these programs teach young athletes the fundamentals of the game while building their confidence, getting them active, and helping them learn valuable lessons in teamwork, sportsmanship, and leadership.

Equity, Girls & Sports online panel discussions helped to promote health and wellness, self-confidence, teamwork, decision-making and social skills, and, above all, perseverance. Women in sports smash gender stereotypes, providing inspiring role models for all girls, and portraying gender equality.

YMCA PLAY (Physical Learning Activities for Youth) is rooted in the idea that every moment is a teaching moment. A well-designed play program is all fun and games to the kids, and a science to the coach. Our daily objectives are simple: Make kids laugh, sweat and learn while cultivating genuine kindness, respect and responsibility.

EDUCATION

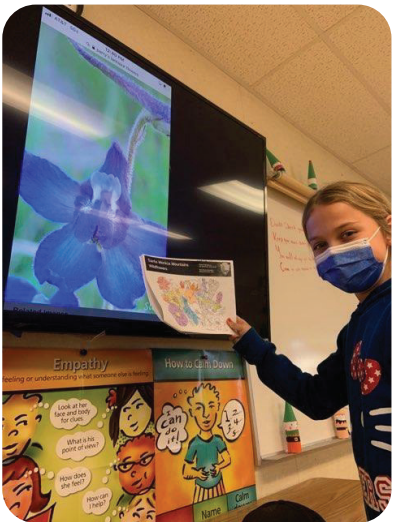
Ensuring Success

The Y's educational programs and initiatives are ensuring that every child has the tools they need to get the education that they deserve.

During the pandemic shutdown and COVID-19 restrictions, the Y offered safe, **distance learning support programs** with virtual and/or in-person tutoring to help make sure our children didn't fall behind in school and to help them recover any lost learning.

As the Y reopened in spring of 2021, we offered dozens of **day camps** and **youth development classes** for kids of all ages and interests. Y camps and classes give kids the opportunity to try something new like STEM, theater, crafts, sports, dance and so much more!

As part of the Y's youth development curriculum, we focus on five core values – caring, honesty, respect, inclusion and responsibility. In addition, we incorporate key learning skills between transitional kindergarten-12th grade including critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication.

Today's Teens are Tomorrow's Leaders

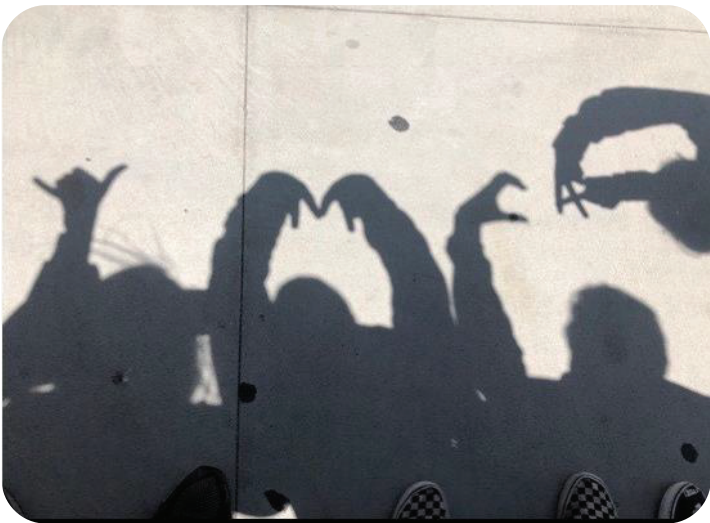
The Y has an incredible offering of programs that are designed to engage kids and teens and transform them into our next generation of change makers.

BOLD GOLD, Youth Institute, and summer overnight camps located in the Angeles National Forest provide our children with an escape from life in the city where they'll make lifelong friends and learn incredible life lessons.

Our **Teens & Government** program for high school students focuses on municipal government and local activity. Our teen delegates debate their bills in committees, then on the floor of the Assembly and Senate, and if passed, their bills are sent on to the Youth Governor.

The Y's 2020 "**Get Summer**" virtual teen initiative engaged hundreds of teens in health and mental wellness challenges during the summer.

Our **Youth Advisory Council** has had a great year leading our teens in virtual engagement events including Teen Trivia Night and a Virtual Teen Wellness Week.

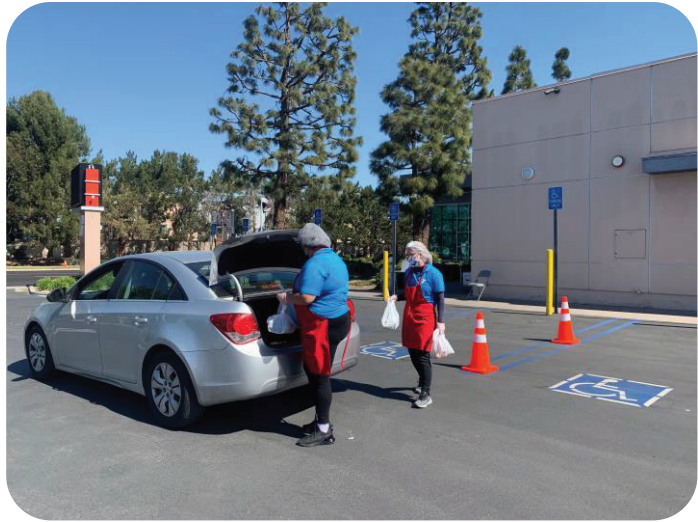
FOOD INSECURITY

Committed to Supporting Our Neighbors

Due to statewide stay at home orders, all of the seniors we served daily lunches to prior to March 13, 2020 were suddenly required to isolate at home. In addition, many more seniors found themselves in need of food due to the risk involved with visiting local stores or restaurants.

The YMCA converted from our congregate meal program to 100% **home delivery meals** from March 16 through May 31, 2020 and expanded service from 5,500 meals annually to over 9,500 meals per month. We have maintained that volume and offer a **weekly fresh and frozen meal pickup service** for those seniors who are able to do so, and we are continuing home delivery for those who need it.

We anticipate that our efforts will reduce food insecurity among seniors in isolation and are committed to offering this service with the support of volunteers to our senior communities in Torrance, Redondo Beach, Carson, Hawthorne, and Lennox through all of 2021.

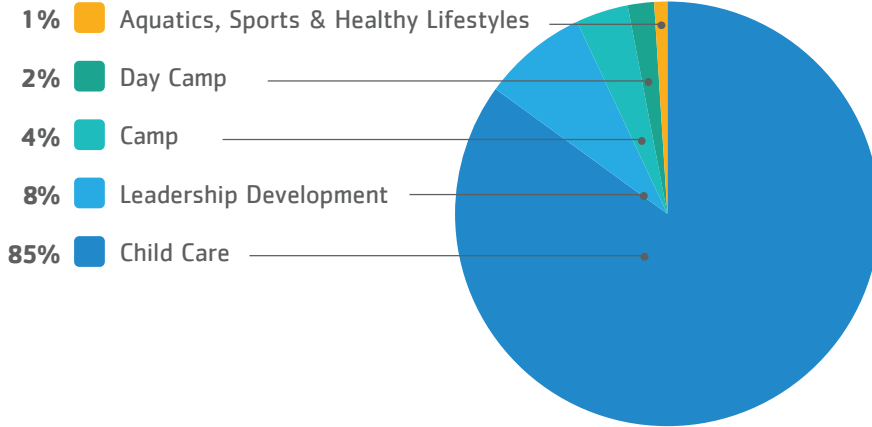

Dean and Susan Reuter have recently joined the President’s Club demonstrating their generous commitment to the future preservation and legacy of the Torrance-South Bay YMCA.

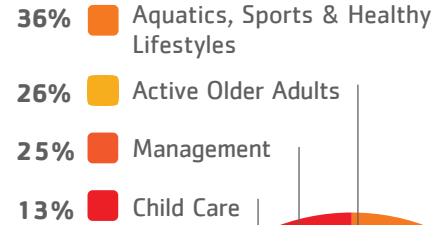

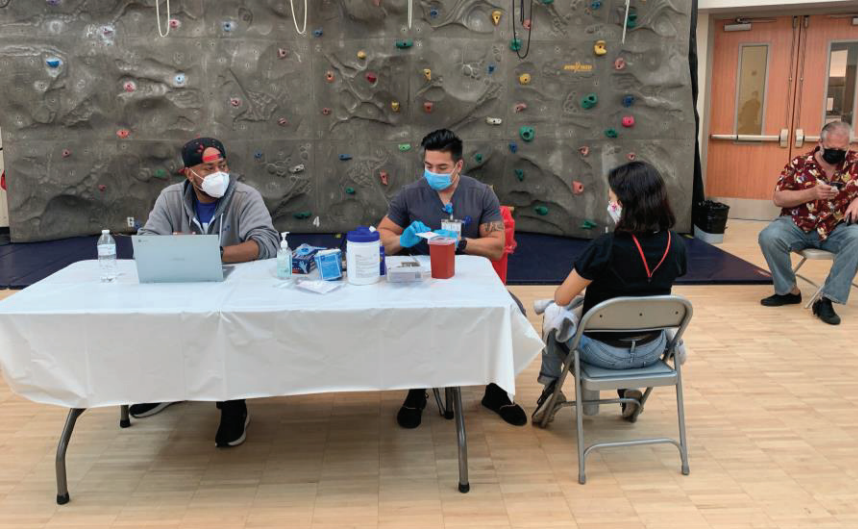

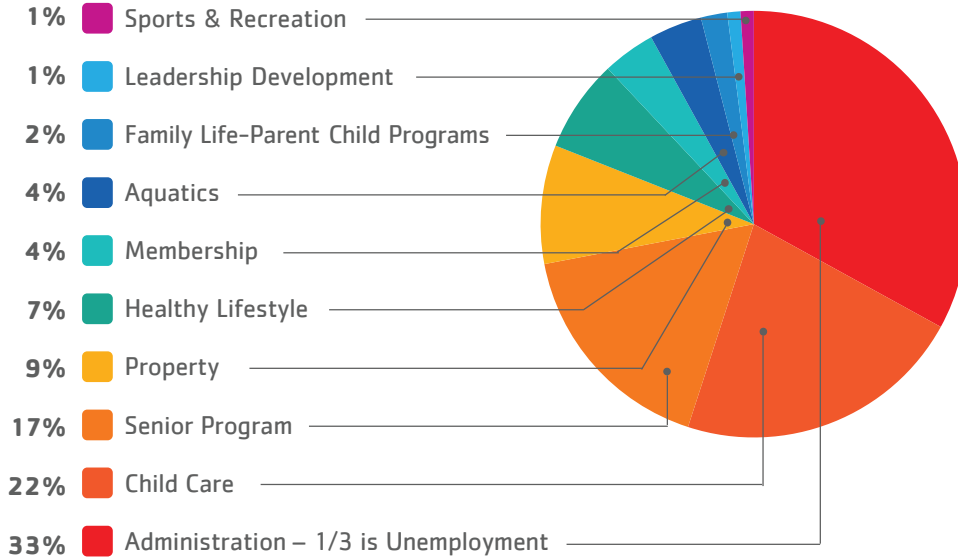
